KAHOOT EVALUATION RESULTS

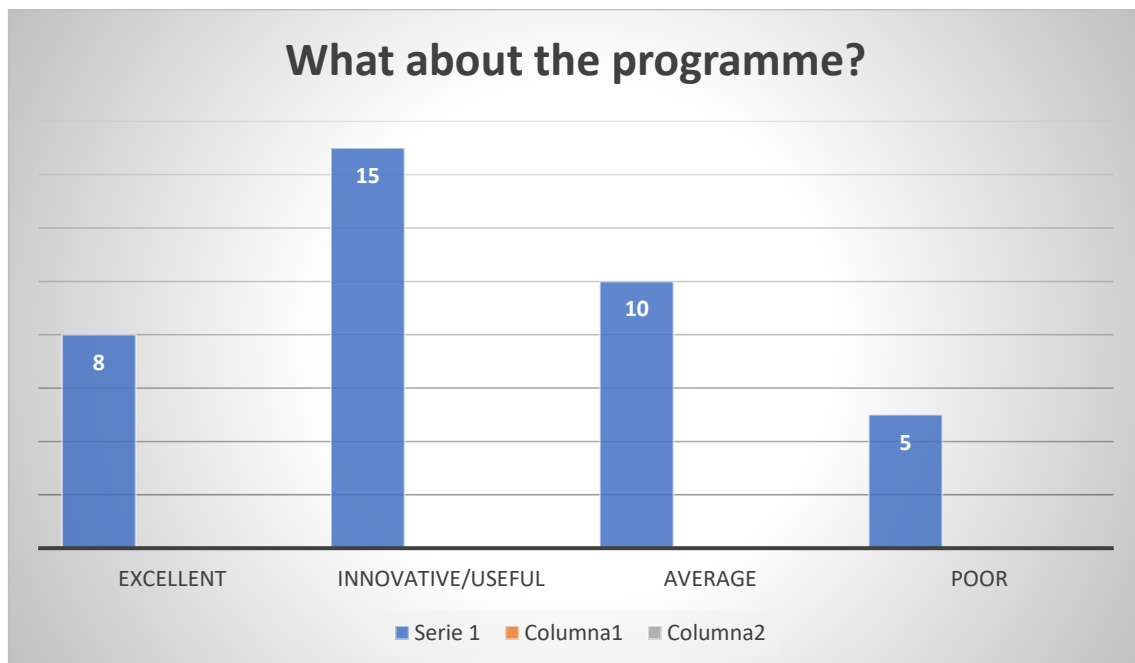
40 participants (43% of attendants to the Convention) /8 questions

Most sessions were not plenaries, that is why in some cases there are many "not attended" responses.

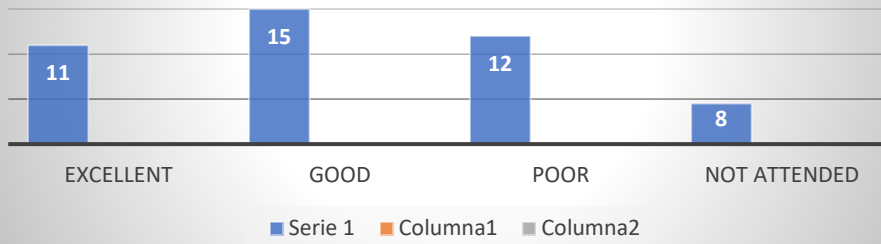
Summary of results:

- More than 50% of the participants in the evaluation session considered the programme excellent or innovative and useful. Only 5 people thought it was a poor programme.
- Sessions 2 (Bradley) and 3 (McLoughlin) were considered to be excellent by the majority of respondents
- Sessions 1 (Thornbury), 4 (Warren) and 5 (Rennie) were considered to be good by the majority of respondents
- The most highly-rated sessions have been Bradley's (64% of excellents), McLoughlin's (46% of excellents) and Horsfall (33% of excellents).
- 18 out of 40 considered the content of the programme very appropriate in relation to the Convention title, and 13 thought it was quite closely related. Five people found no relation at all, and 21 were not sure.

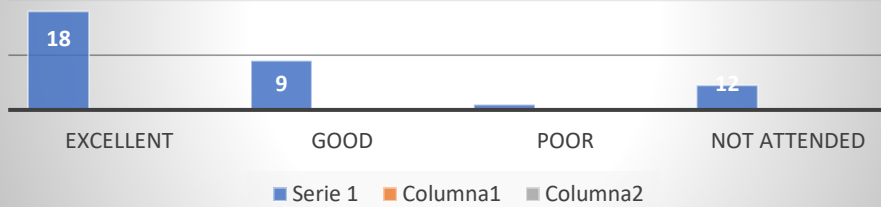

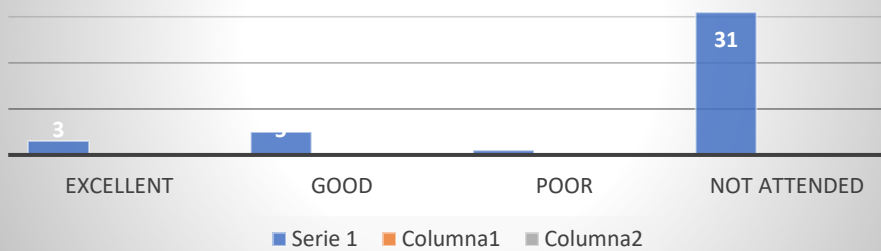

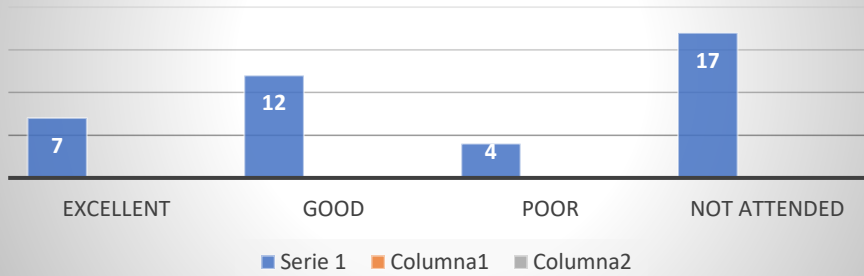

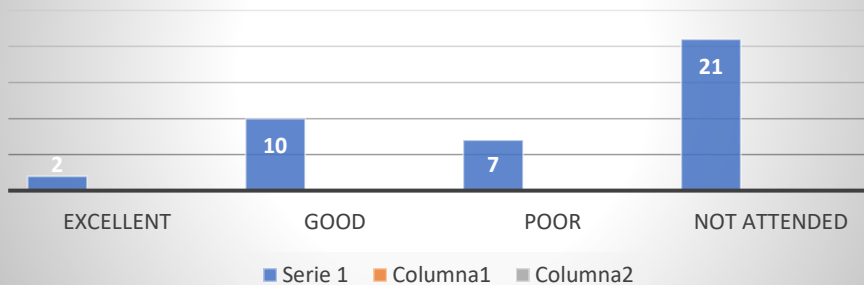

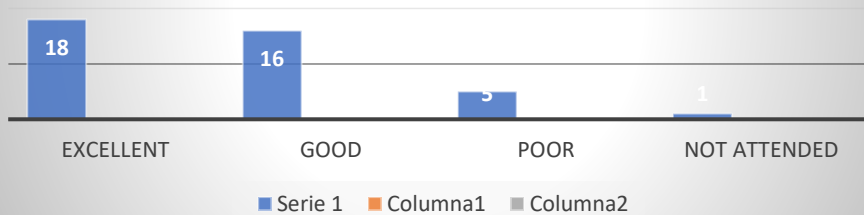
